
CFBNJ Provides Grants to Local Organizations

Earlier this year, the Community FoodBank of New Jersey (CFBNJ), Mercer Street Friends, and Norwescap selected 292 community partners, including food pantries, soup kitchens, and more, across 18 counties to receive grants through a \$3.5 million investment in network capacity. Though these local food assistance organizations are more essential than ever, many of them are struggling financially, as they've experienced unexpected and increased expenses due to the pandemic.

Awards ranging from \$5,000 to \$15,000 were given to help these partners expand their capabilities during this time of historic food insecurity by funding additional refrigeration, household and hygiene items for clients, transportation, equipment to enable outdoor distributions, and other critical needs. These grants, which were given in collaboration with the New Jersey Pandemic Relief Fund's Endurance Grants program,

represent the first round of a larger, multi-year Network Investment Initiative. CFBNJ is also grateful to the Community Foundation of New Jersey for their generous support and partnership in facilitating the grant awards.

Bloomfield Presbyterian Church on the Green Food Pantry, a grant recipient in Essex County, has gone from serving about 60 people each month to serving about 500 people each month. The funds from CFBNJ have helped them to pay for winterization expenses, repairs to their kitchen floor, a new freezer, additional shelving, and diapers to distribute to clients.


"We expect that the need will stay more or less on this level, which is way beyond what we're used to," said Don Cornell, Food Pantry Director. "We wouldn't be able to continue serving this many people without the grant from the FoodBank."

Approximately 95% of grant applicants reported significant increases in demand for food assistance over the past year, and elevated levels of food insecurity precipitated by COVID-19 may continue after the pandemic has ended.

At the James O. Bryant Food Pantry in Piscataway, Middlesex County, the grant has increased their capacity so greatly that they can now participate in CFBNJ's gleaning direct program, picking up donated food from their local supermarket that they didn't have enough storage to accept previously. The pantry's clientele has more than doubled since the start of the pandemic, so they have purchased new equipment to allow them to continue providing more food than ever before.

"With the grant from the FoodBank, the pantry is giving people nutritious food and making them feel cared for," said Wilhelmina Bryant, Food Pantry Director. "It's breaking down barriers, because people who would not have come to a food pantry before are finding themselves in need now."

The James O. Bryant Food Pantry in Piscataway has been a pillar of hope in the community since 1994, assisting hundreds of neighbors in need each month out of the double garage of

The pantry is also a grant recipient through CFBNJ's Network Investment Initiative. They have used the funds awarded to purchase hygiene items for clients, a new commercial refrigerator, additional shelving, and hand trucks.

"This grant has been a very good opportunity for us and for members of the community," said Wilhelmina Bryant, Food Pantry Director.

With CFBNJ as their primary source of food, they now serve between 800 and 1,000 clients per month - more than double as many as they served before the pandemic. This has led to a need for greater capacity to accept and distribute food, and fortunately, the pantry is now able to participate in CFBNJ's gleaning direct program thanks to the new equipment funded by the grant. They visit their local supermarket three Fridays a month to pick up generous donations of produce, bread, and to-go meals.

"This allows us to accept more food from the FoodBank. It allows us to accept more from supermarkets and individuals who wish to make donations. It makes a huge difference," Wilhelmina told us. "I would've been appreciative of this grant if we had gotten it five years ago, but I'm super appreciative of it now because this is the time when we need it most."

HELPING HANDS

Robert, John, and Bill are three of our most dedicated volunteers who became friends while helping out at CFBNJ. They come every week to our Hillside warehouse to scoop pasta, pack emergency meal kits, work in the kitchen, and more – assisting in any way that they can. "When you enter the front door of the FoodBank, you know that you're entering into a different place," they told us. "There's a lot of humility, mutual respect, camaraderie, friendliness, and also dedication to accomplishing a goal." The three are retired now and donate their time to help feed neighbors in need. "Unfortunately, many people are having very

hard times, but anything that can be done to help them is a great thing, they said.

With locations in Vineland and Port Norris, Building New Lives, Inc. has been serving South Jersey neighbors in need since 2016.

The pantry is also a grant recipient through CFBNJ's Network Investment Initiative. They have used the funds awarded for a renovation of their facility that will help them to better accommodate a choice pantry model – allowing clients to shop as they would at a grocery store. They have also purchased new equipment, including a freezer and a rolling conveyor belt, to increase their capacity to accept and distribute food.

"This opportunity means so much to us," said Sharon Dobbins, Executive Director. "Before we received this grant, we didn't have any income at all."

With no money coming in, the pantry previously relied entirely on donated items and equipment. CFBNJ serves as their sole source of food.

Building New Lives, Inc. serves 60 to 80 people per month per location and also takes a van full of food to a senior center each month, providing nourishment for about 30 struggling residents.

"There are so many people in our community who are hungry. It's been such a blessing to serve people who might otherwise go without," Sharon told us. "If you don't have food, you can't live, and without nutritious food comes bad health issues. I'm grateful that we'll be able to feed more people with this grant from the FoodBank."

HELPING HANDS

Elaine is recently retired from forty years as a cashier at ShopRite, one of CFBNJ's oldest and most committed corporate supporters. Their annual Partners in Caring campaign inspired her to start volunteering to sort food at our Egg Harbor Township location. "Right now, there are a lot of people who are out of work. Many of them worked in the casinos. It's really been tough," she told us. She comes in twice a week, dedicating her time and energy to helping her South Jersey neighbors in need.

"It feels great to volunteer at the FoodBank, knowing that I'm helping somebody," Elaine said.









Zesty Watermelon Salsa

4 tbs lime juice

1 tbs sugar

4 cups watermelon (cubed)

1 small yellow pepper (1/4 inch dice)

1 jalapeño pepper (1/8 inch dice)

1 small red onion (1/8 inch dice)
