National Diaper Need Awareness Week, September 24 – October 2, 2022





Dear #GreatBigDiaperDrive Organizer,

Thank you for partnering with the Community FoodBank of New Jersey (CFBNJ) on our second annual #GreatBig Diaper Drive! Last year's inaugural drive was a great success! We collected over 5,000 pounds in donations, wipes, and creams. We raised over \$32,000 for CFBNJ's Diaper Program (\$1 = 6 diapers!) and generated roughly 3 million social media impressions while 54 people attended our Lunch & Learn webinar.

We are just getting started! Diaper need is something we can all solve together!

CFBNJ, our state's largest anti-hunger and anti-poverty organization, is a member of Feeding America® and the National Diaper Bank Network (NDBN). CFBNJ currently distributes diapers to over 175 community partner agencies throughout the state and is excited to be expanding its reach to more underserved areas. NDBN'S member diaper banks in NJ distribute over 1.9 million diapers annually, helping over 3,200 infants and toddlers monthly.

National Diaper Need Awareness Week is September 24-October 2. Together we can create some energy around diaper need, an important and often hidden public health issue that has only been exacerbated by COVID-19, inflation, and supply chain problems. Did you know that 1 in 3 families in the U.S. cannot afford diapers? Babies require up to 12 diapers per day, which adds up to \$70-\$80 per month per child -- a cost many struggling families simply cannot afford. In addition, diapers are not covered by most federally funded public assistance programs such as SNAP or WIC because they are not food items. Simply put, no parent should have to make the impossible choice between food and diapers for their child.

## 1. PLAN YOUR DRIVE:

Determine the scope of your project. Product Collection Drive alone? Or collection and simultaneous Virtual Drive?

Note: Every \$1 donated can provide 6 diapers for a family in need. With its enormous purchasing power, CFBNJ can procure more diapers per dollar than any individual alone. In addition, some people in your community may want to skip the store and elect to participate in #GreatBigDiaperDrive virtually. We can easily customize a donation page for your group, just ask! # 2. MAKE THE LOGISTICS EASY:

Choose central, easily accessible drop-off location(s), and select a start and end date for your collection. Please tell us your timetable too so we'll be expecting your items. (See page 5 for drop off signage.)

# 3. SPREAD THE WORD:

Announce your drive via social media, emails, and notices to your specific group. (See next page.)

### 4. READY SET COLLECT!

The most needed items are:

- Diapers, all sizes (newborn through pullups), especially 4, 5 and 6, as well as adult diapers
- Baby Wipes
- Baby Cream

Important Note: All items must be new and in original packaging.

### 5. DELIVER YOUR DIAPERS!

Once you've collected your haul, set up transportation to deliver your donated diapers and/or diaper-related items. You can drop off at our Hillside or Egg Harbor Township (EHT) warehouse, directly to a designated drop off site (see page 7) or a local network partner (search our <u>Find Food</u> app for a full listing of partners). You may also choose your own recipient organization. If dropping off at CFBNJ, please try to have donations at the FoodBank by early to mid-October to meet our inventory needs. For help, please contact lparisier@basqnyc.com (Hillside service area) or kathycorbalis@gmail.com (EHT service area). Then, report back to us how you did! # What is Diaper Need?

- Diaper need is the lack of a sufficient number of diapers to keep a baby clean, dry, and healthy.
- Babies require up to 12 diapers a day, toddlers about eight.

# The Consequences of Diaper Need

- Babies who remain too long in a soiled diaper are exposed to potential health risks.
- Most child care centers, even free and subsidized facilities, require parents to provide a day's supply of disposable diapers.
- Many parents cannot go to work or school if they can't leave their babies at child care.

# The Numbers



**4**: The number of days of work or school missed in the past month, on average, by over half of parents experiencing diaper need.




\$70-80: Average monthly cost of diapers per child.



**14**% of New Jerseyans under five years of age receive SNAP, slightly higher than national average.



**3,251**: The number of New Jersey infants, toddlers, and mothers who participate in Early Head Start and need diapers to do so.
