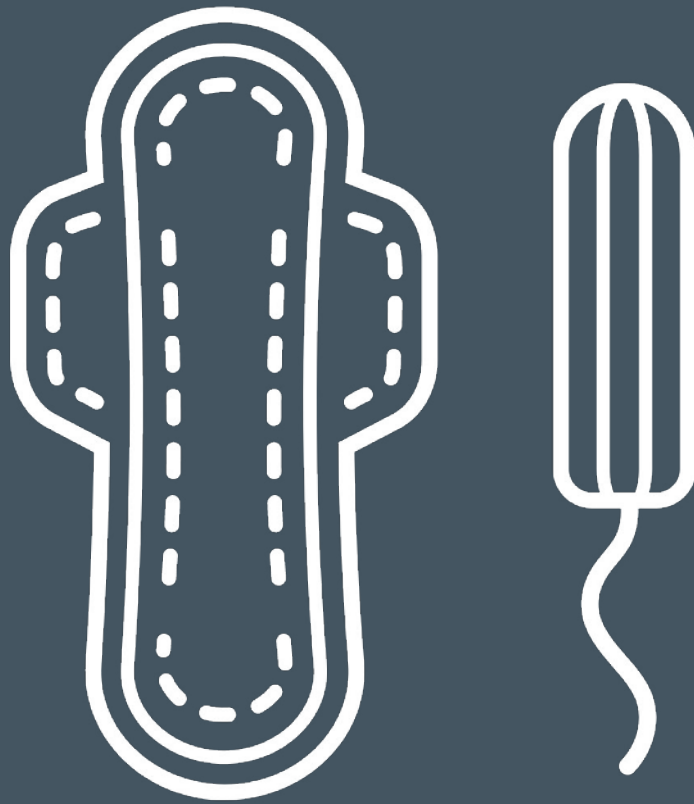

Dear Friend of Women Fighting Hunger,

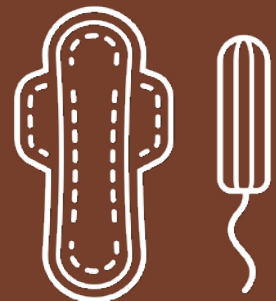
Welcome to our 5th annual Great Big Period Product Drive (#GBPPD)! We're so glad you're here. This toolkit is your starting point to take action and help ensure that no one in our community has to miss school, work, or daily life because they can't afford period supplies.

The need is real: 1 in 3 low-income women in the U.S. report missing work, school, or other important commitments due to lack of access to these essential items. Because period products aren't covered by most federally funded assistance programs, and with the high cost of living in New Jersey, too many individuals are forced to go without.

But together, we can change that.

Join a growing movement of advocates who believe menstrual products should be as accessible as toilet paper in schools and public spaces. Host a drive. Rally your network. Spread the word. Every action makes a difference. Additionally, every five donated period products provides a full day of worry-free care for a neighbor in need.

WHAT CAN YOU DO?



1. HOST A PERIOD PRODUCT DRIVE

Set a designated drop-off location for people to drop off donations of pads, tampons, and panty liners. Period products of any kind are accepted as long as they are in their original and unopened packaging. You can also choose to utilize CFBNJ's Amazon wishlist with suggested products can be shipped to your designated drop-off location or directly to CFBNJ (see links below).

3. ORGANIZE A FUNDRAISING EVENT

4. RAISE AWARENESS + ADVOCATE + EDUCATE

In New Jersey, there are continued efforts at the state level to address access to period products, as well as the sale and marketing/labeling of period products reflecting a growing awareness of this critical need.

Talking Points: ABOUT PERIOD POVERTY



In New Jersey, 1 in 9 women and girls between the ages of 12 and 44 lives below the Federal Poverty Line — this is more than 200,000 people who struggle to cover basic bills, and have to make hard choices about which essential items they must go without every single month.

- **Period Poverty is a poverty issue.** The lack of material basic necessities can force women to stay home from work or school, depressing their wages as well as micro-economic productivity. It can also lead to false choices between the products they need to maintain good health or other necessities such as food, rent and/or utilities.
- **Period Poverty is a public health issue.** Individuals experiencing period poverty are sometimes forced to use proxy items such as toilet paper or unclean rags - even using products for longer periods of time than recommended which can have serious health implications.
- **Period Poverty is a gender equity issue.** The lack of accessibility and affordability of period supplies can prevent girls and young women from attending school or going to work which further widens the inequality gap in education and economic empowerment of women and girls.
- In the U.S., two in five (2 in 5) menstruators struggle to purchase period products.
- One in three (1 in 3) low-income women have reported missing work, school, or similar commitments due to lack of access to period supplies.
- Nearly one in four (1 in 4) students in the U.S. struggles to afford period supplies
- 30 states do not tax period products, including New Jersey.

The Community FoodBank of New Jersey (CFBNJ) began in the back of our founder's station wagon in 1975 and is now the largest anti-hunger organization in the state, a leader in anti-poverty work, and a member of Feeding America. We serve as a champion for addressing root causes of hunger, delivering neighbor-centered solutions and fostering collaborative partnerships across all sectors of society for New Jersey. For almost 50 years, we have provided food, help, and hope to neighbors in need through economic crises, disasters, and other hardships.

Since 2018, CFBNJ's signature menstrual equity program, the Period Initiative, has provided sustained distribution of monthly period supplies. Building upon CFBNJ's history as an emergency provider of hygiene supplies and its capacity for large-scale distribution across, the program currently works with almost 200 community partners including campus pantries, schools and shelters. We are an affiliated program of the Alliance for Period Supplies.
